



#### Creating The Signalman

I first came across Dickens' chilling story when looking for material to include in a simple ghost story-telling engagement with English Heritage. Instantly I could see the dramatic potential for two actors; the claustrophobic setting, the strong psychological dimensions, the opportunity for a few choice effects; above all, perhaps, the ambiguous nature of the haunting and its meaning. It was one of Dickens' final works and heavily inspired by his own involvement in a railway accident, the after-effects of which are thought by some to have led to his early demise. Dickens draws the character of the signalman strongly, but sketches his interrogator only roughly, so my greatest challenge was in creating an internal world for him. He turned into something of an eccentric, influenced by my reading of the activities of genuine Victorian ghost hunters.



The name "Furzan" popped out from an interpretive board I was reading at Helmsley Castle, (on my first outing telling ghost stories) being the name of an old family who had once lived there. It seemed propitious.

#### M R James

Montague Rhodes James (1862 - 1936) was an English author, scholar and Provost of Kings College Cambridge (1905 - 18), and of Eton College (1918 - 36).

He is rightly regarded as one of our greatest writers of supernatural stories, publishing numerous collections. James introduced a more naturalistic and contemporary setting to the genre and a sinister and suggestive style in telling his tales.

Oh Whistle and I'll Come to you has been

adapted numerous times for stage and tv most memorably by Jonathan Millar in 1968 for the BBC.

It follows the typical "Jamesian" formula- a setting in an English village, seaside town (often East Anglian) or country estate; a nondescript and

rather naive gentleman-scholar as protagonist, the discovery of an old book or other antiquarian object that somehow unlocks, calls down the

wrath, or at least attracts the unwelcome attention of, a supernatural menace. I have taken the liberty of using this formula as the narrative spine for a spoof of the genre.

Over the last 25 years I have created many plays based on the work of great authors, Kipling,

Conan-Doyle, Defoe, Austen, and have always believed that the the authors would have been not too displeased, on this occasion however, I have no doubt that if M R James "was alive today, he would be turning in his grave"

#### Director's note

The themes of these two short stories are very similar; faith versus fact, the supernatural, the reliability of one's own brain, yet they are very different in tone. Corble's adaptation focuses on the dark psychology of his characters whilst Dimon has created a tongue in cheek take on the genre that still manages to create a sense of unease. This has provided challenges; how to create two contrasting atmospheres within one coherent evening of theatrical entertainment, but working with two actors who understand each other so well and a team who understand the artistic vision of North Country has made it both possible and pleasurable.

#### **Nobby Dimon**



Nobby has been the Artistic Director of North Country Theatre since it was founded in 1996, writing, adapting as well as directing most of the company's output.

His adaptation with Simon Corble of Buchan's *The 39 Steps* inspired the West End production that received an Olivier Award as BEST NEW COMEDY in February 2007, took the both Critics' and People's Choice Awards plus a couple of Tonys on Broadway. His adaptation of DH Lawrence's *The Rocking Horse Winner*, received rave reviews locally, regionally and nationally.

He has also directed for Cleveland Theatre Company, Harrogate Theatre, Durham Theatre Company, Charivari and Snap Theatre.

#### **Mark Cronfield**



Mark has appeared in numerous North Country productions including last year's *The Wish House* and helping to run and perform in this Summers

youth theatre project *The Bull Dancers* at the Dales Countryside Museum, a hugely enjoyable week which culminated in their auction mart space being transformed into a miniature amphitheatre and the palace of Knossos.

Mark works regularly for Time Will Tell Theatre and has performed for many companies including The National Theatre, Theatre Hullabaloo and three over eden. He has been a professional actor for 20 years and his Mum is still waiting for him to get a role in *Emmerdale*.



#### **Vivienne Garnett**

Vivienne joined North Country Theatre for its 20th anniversary year in 2016 as Associate Director. Her first professional acting job was with the company back in 2005, playing Cathy in *The Imitation Game*, and eleven years later she made her directorial debut with *The Wish House*, as well as being a member of the cast. She has performed many times on the North Country stage in *Prisoner of Zenda*, *Home on the Range*, *The Lighthouse on Shivering Sands* and *The Wish House* to

name a few, and has also appeared at Frinton Summer Season in Essex and at Gasworks and Chapel Off Chapel in Melbourne.

#### Matt Blackmore Technical and Touring Stage Management

Matt is a freelance lighting, stage and sound technician who is employed by a number of professional theatre and dance companies. This is the first production Matt has worked on with North Country Theatre. He was previously the Technical Manager for the Priestley Centre for the Arts and Square Chapel Centre for the Arts. Matt has no qualifications in theatre whatsoever — but does have a degree in philosophy — and so has learned by making a lot of mistakes and then finding a way to correct them. Recent companies he has worked with include Northern Ballet, Adverse Camber and The New Bradford Playhouse.

#### Jonny Buck Set Construction

Jonny is a Bradford-based woodworker who created the first map and stepladder set for *The 39 Steps* back in 1996. Those two pairs of solid stepladders have been repainted numerous times and appeared in several North Country productions in the intervening years. He created the Illyria flats for *Twelfth Night* and the kitchen set for *The Wish House*. He works with a number of theatre companies whilst managing his own commercial joinery business.

#### Lindsay Trenholme Rehearsal Assistant Stage Manager

Spent 20 years working in production for BBC TV, ranging from being a runner on I, Claudius to Assistant Floor Manager on *Blackadder's Christmas Carol* and *The Hour of the Pig* with Colin Firth. Returned home to Yorkshire as a Stage Manager for several years with *Emmerdale* and *Heartbeat*, and first joined North Country Theatre rehearsals in 2011 for *The Rocking Horse Winner* and has been involved with the creation of almost every show since then.

#### Tony Wilcock Lighting Design

Tony is Production Manager at the Georgian Theatre Royal Richmond and has designed lighting and technical aspects of all North Country Shows since 2012, most recently *The Wish House*.

#### Alice Lawson Costume

Richmond-based costume maker-designer and wardrobe mistress Alice first worked for us whilst still a student in Leicester and has since designed and made costume and wardrobe managed several shows including the challenge of the massive community play project *Blame it on Bartle* in 2014.
