is a professional theatre company based in the beautiful market town of Richmond in North Yorkshire. Under the direction of its Artistic Director Nobby Dimon it has created many original new plays along with exciting adaptations of classic novels since it began in 1996.

It has a special understanding of the nature of touring to a rural area as well as educational and site specific drama. It is committed to giving exciting, entertaining and intelligent theatre to audiences whose access to live theatre is limited by geography or who simply enjoy sharing the experience of live theatre in their local community. We would like to express our gratitude to the local promoters, the majority of whom are unpaid, whose hard work allows us to visit their venues.



Federico Garcia Lorca was born near Granada in Andalucia in 1898. After first studying law he became more interested in poetry and the theatre and published poems and dramas throughout his twenties. He

year that Lorca wrote Blood

became a friend of Salvador Dali who made sets for his first play, and was a figure in the Spanish avant garde. In 1931 he formed and led La Barraca, a theatre company, to take classic drama to the provinces. Bodas de Sangre (Blood Wedding) his most famous play was written in 1933, followed quickly by Yerma, and La Casa de Bernada Alba.

A supporter of the Republican Government, at the beginning of the Civil War he was arrested by Fascist (Franco-ist) militia in 1936, shot, and his body thrown in an unmarked mass grave.

Regarded as one of Spain's greatest poets, his reputation as a playwright has ebbed and flowed over the years since his untimely death. His poetic non-naturalistic style has been highly regarded by students of drama as an important break from the stodgy realism of some early 20th century drama. Characters like The Moon and Death and poetic choruses appear, love, pride, passion, fate and death are recurring themes and he has sometimes seemed too melodramatic for English tastes.

Why "In Wensleydale"?

Blood Wedding is a play about feuding families in isolated farming communities. It seems to me that many rural communities across Europe share certain characteristics - an inherent social conservatism, traditional culture, strong community, anxiety about the encroaching



Comfort Farm ("I saw something nasty in the

wood shed"), a hilarious send up of the rural doom and gloom novels of Thomas Hardy and Mary Webb (Precious Bane).

The idea of somehow mixing the hot passion of Spain with the cool stoicism and irony of England seemed potentially amusing. The idea of a rural Yorkshireman

joining the International Brigade to fight for freedom in Spain created a bridge between the two remote societies and, I hope, kept a little thread of seriousness underneath the parody. Laurie Lee's As I Walked Out One Midsummer Morning and Ken Loach's Land and Freedom were also sources of ideas.

Tell them in England, if they ask, What brought us to these wars, To this plateau beneath the night's Grave manifold of stars -It was not fraud or foolishness. Glory, revenge, or pay: We came because our open eyes Could see no other way

Nicola Downing Costume designer

Nicola trained at the London College of Fashion in Advance Craft Ladies Tailoring, Pattern Cutting & Design. She has worked at Covent Garden Opera House, Worcester Swan, The Royal Northampton, and Harrogate Theatre.

In 1981 she established own design and tailoring workrooms in Harrogate which now encompasses work for theatres on a contract basis, cutting, making and wardrobe supervision.

Recent work includes making and supervising costumes on Harrogate Youth Theatre productions of *Wind in the Willows* and *The BFG*. She was also Head Cutter and Wardrobe Supervisor on Harrogate Theatre's 2008-9 pantomime *Cinderella* and 2009-10 pantomime *Aladdin*, as well as a number of touring productions. Nicola is presently working, with a wonderful crew on Harrogate Theatre's 2010-11 Pantomime *Dick Whittington*.

Simon Pell Scenic artist

Simon trained at The Slade and worked as a Scenic Artist at the National Theatre before moving to County Durham in 1987. Since then has designed over 150 shows for a variety of companies, including; The Gala Theatre, Durham (resident designer 2006-10), Welfare State International, Durham Theatre Co, Cleveland Theatre Co, Promenade Promotions, and Jack Drum Arts. He is also Artistic Director of The Castle Players in Barnard Castle. He is delighted to be working for North Country Theatre again, this being the eleventh show he has designed for them since 1997.

Malcolm Wood Stage carpenter

Malcolm Wood is a self employed joiner who has contributed design ideas and constructed sets for numerous North Country productions. His knowledge of early magicians and his experience of Punch and Judy are invaluable as is his knowledge of pin hinges, drill bits and "2 × 1". Thomas Weir Technician

Thomas is working for a sixth time with North Country Theatre having previously worked on *The Imitation Game, The 39 Steps* and *The Man Who Would Be King, The Prisoner of Zenda* and *Home on the Range.* Thomas did a seven-year stint at the Octagon Theatre Bolton where he has designed both lighting and sound for numerous productions the most recent being *I Just Stopped By To See The Man* by Stephen Jeffreys. He has worked and designed with numerous theatrical companies and venues around the country. They include Belgrade Theatre, Buxton Opera House, Opera House Manchester, Everyman Theatre Liverpool and Pitlochry Festival Theatre amongst others.

Nobby Dimon

Has been the Artistic Director of North Country Theatre since it was founded in 1996. He has been writer adapter as well as director of most of the company's output since then,

including acclaimed adaptations of J. L. Carr's A Month in the Country, Austen's Northanger Abbey, and Conan Doyle's The Lost World, as well as writing the large scale community play for Richmondshire Last Dance of a Dalesman, which moved its audience from gales of laughter to tears and back again. His adaptation with Simon Corble of Buchan's The 39 Steps inspired the West End Production that received an Olivier Award as BEST NEW COMEDY in February 2007. Described as "uproariously funny... strikingly inventive" in the Guardian, as well as the Critics' Choice it also won the People's Choice Award and the Broadway production won a couple of Tony Awards.


Orla Cottingham

Sophia Hatfield graduated from Manchester School of Theatre in 2008. Her most recent theatre work includes Mona in Ella Hickson's critically acclaimed *Eight* at the Lowry Theatre Salford



and a second tour with Fuse Theatre for Young People. She reads regularly for the new-writing workshop Incubate at Bolton Octagon. Her other past theatre credits include *The Caucasian Chalk Circle, Teechers, After Mrs Rochester, Victory* and *Hamlet*. Recent film work includes commercials for New Balance and The Open University. Sophia is also playing a lead role in the independent comedy feature *The Best Little Whorehouse in Rochdale* written and directed by Ian Vernon, currently in production.
